

How to sell your produce on the community stall at the Gloucester Farmers Market

When the Market opens at 8.30am on Saturday 13th February your veggies, fruit or other home-grown produce can be for sale on the community stall. Whether you have one or two pumpkins excess to your needs or a box full of home-grown sweet corn, the community stall offers a way to sell your produce without setting up your own stall independently. The community stall will also be selling fruit and vegetables grown at the *Tucker Garden Patch*, a demonstration garden developed by *The Gloucester Project (TPG)* situated at the corner of Bucketts Way and Fairbairns Road.

If you wish to register your interest in selling produce on the community stall you can download a registration form and more information via the internet at www.thegloucesterproject.org.au or telephone Terry Hardwick on 0419 018 419 and ask her to mail or email you the form. Terry has devised a tally sheet to keep track of sales and calculate how much to deposit in your bank account. A small percentage will be deducted from your sale money to cover set-up and running costs of the stall. The community stall offers a first step for potential growers around the district to “try out” their produce at the Gloucester Farmers Market. It will operate every month at the Gloucester Farmers Market as a regular stall with a wide variety of produce from local small scale growers.
